It has been a busy, exciting, wonderful and difficult summer and it has been refreshing to have the winds of fall bringing in change. In July I was able to take a little bit of time away which was needed and I enjoyed very much. At the end of July we ran a basketball camp with the church in Leutkirch, Germany. This was the second year that we did this. We had 40 participants in the camp who were able to hear a gospel testimony each day of the camp. On the last day, we decided to hold a Grillfest for the parents to come and fellowship as awards were handed out. Before we handed out the awards, a full gospel presentation was given. We are so thankful to have had this opportunity. There were around 100 people present and they all sat and listened to the Gospel. Please pray for the seed that was sown to produce fruit.



The Café in Leutkirch, Germany continues to run 3 days a week and we continue to be amazed at the gospel opportunities and open doors the Lord provides every week. We would also appreciate your continued prayers for this ministry.

I mentioned that it has also been difficult, but I don't want you to worry. They are the typical difficulties that you all face and we all need to trust the Lord for. Hospitalizations, deaths, dealing with people struggling, questions about the future...all things we need to constantly turn to Jesus for and learn to rest in His arms. I'm so thankful that He calls His followers to rest in Him and this is a good reminder that we need to all pray for each other.

I would also like to ask you to pray for the Bible Study in Liechtenstein. We are sensing a turning point here and praying about what the Lord would have our next steps to be. We want to be careful and approach this with wisdom. Please pray for us and I hope to have more details in my next letter.

This week and next week our church in Leutkirch will be hosting a Christian History Exposition. The "travelling museum" will be set up in our church room for 1 ½ weeks and we have invited the school religion classes and the community to come by. The topic is "How Christianity Changed the World."

During this week we will also be hosting a concert on Wednesday night, Oct. 9, with the intent to share the gospel. The audience will be given a chance to respond at the end of the evening.
