It's almost July already. Summer has flown by thus far. Here in Wisconsin, time has flown, but the warm weather is very slow in getting here. It will be warm for a few days and then cold. I officially believe summer in Wisconsin is about eight weeks long—that's all. But God is good either way, and we are thankful for the many blessings He gives us daily. His mercies are truly new every morning. We are grateful for you all and your faithful support to us and the souls in Tanzania. Not only are we grateful for your financial support, but we are also grateful for your prayer support. Thank you for continuing to pull the rope with us as we go, win, disciple, and teach.

Ministry:

The Lord is good and allowed us to have some productive months in May and June. We were able to put in doors and windows in our village church in Kiagaya. It was a blessing to be able to help them. It is important that God's house looks nice. God is a first-class God, and we always encourage and teach the people that it's not wrong to make God's house look nice.

We started an outreach where we invite different soccer teams to come to church to hear the Gospel, of course, but then afterwards, we play different soccer matches. It's a way to meet people, especially teenagers, where they are. We had 4 teams come one Sunday for a total of 96 teens. Our teens, 65 in total, were great hosts in welcoming them and befriending them. I was very proud of our teens for stepping up to make others feel so welcomed, and our GBC team actually beat one of the really good teams 3-1.

Martha's Health & Family:

Martha is doing well. Since she has been home, she has been on a very strict pill-taking routine, about 40 pills a day. That includes some specialty pills, along with supplements; only one is a traditional cancer-fighting pill, which we would consider to be oral chemo. She had her eight-week specialty labs done. We are still waiting on the results of those. They need to be sent out and can take a little bit of time. She did have her regular labs on June 17, and the doctors were pleased with those. She does have another CT scan on June 24, so if you would, please pray for that. We just continue to trust God and do what we know to do and trust what we don't know.

The kids are loving summer break. This coming August, they will all be in school: Esther in 11th grade, Benjamin in 2nd grade, Rachel in K-5, and Sarah in K-4. I will head back to Tanzania on July 14 and will be there until the end of September.

Thank you all again for the love that you continue to show to our family. We are so thankful and appreciative. Know that our folks in Tanzania are so thankful as well. Thank you for teaming up with us as co-laborers of the Gospel. We write our prayer letter bi-monthly, so if there is a time that you have not heard from us, please reach out. There have been many times that folks have gotten new email addresses or a change in position, and we just kept sending our letter to the wrong address. We want to be sure to keep in touch.
